NEW MAYOR AND COUNCILORS SWORN IN

At the January 3rd Shady Cove City Council Meeting, newly elected Mayor Lena Richardson was sworn in, along with Councilors Dick McGregor and Shari Tarvin. The Shady Cove City Charter states that “At its first meeting of each odd-numbered year, the Council shall elect a President from it’s membership”. The Council President presides over council meetings, and other functions of the office when the Mayor is absent. Steve Mitchell was re-elected to the position of Council President. At the February 7th City Council Meeting, Hank Hohenstein was appointed to the remaining open position on Shady Cove City Council.

FROM MAYOR RICHARDSON’S DESK



In addition to the swearing in of the Mayor, Councilors and electing of the Council President, Council has also started reviewing and revising the City Council Rules of Government to make the document consistent with current Public Meeting Laws and Public Record Laws, in addition to making other necessary changes.

The Council also initiated a City Hall “Visitor Log” to ensure that there is proper follow-up when a citizen comes into City Hall with a question or a concern. The log also is where one would fill in their email information to sign up for the *INSIDER*.

At the January 17th Council Meeting, Colleen Padilla and Rob Merriman from Southern Oregon Regional Economic Development, Inc. (SORED) presented information on activities to promote economic development and prosperity in our regions by helping businesses “launch, relocate and prosper: The Council adopted a proclamation to support SOREDI’s efforts to make Southern Oregon the most business friendly region on the West Coast.

Council interviewed and appointed Mary Magill to an open Shady Cove Planning Commission position. One position remains open on the Planning Commission.

City Administrator, Thomas Corrigan and Mayor Richardson represented Shady Cove at “City Day” at the State Capital sponsored and organized by the League of Oregon Cities (LOC). The morning included presentations by the Governor, Senate and House leaders and LOC staff informing city representatives of new city-related bills and proposed legislation currently in the Senate and House.

In the afternoon the two met with Senator Dennis Linthicum and Representative Mike McLane who represents us in the Oregon State Legislature. Wildfire management, proposed legislation to reform property taxes, PERS challenges and the need for affordable technical and post high school training for our young people in our area was discussed.

The Shady Cove City Charter has not been reviewed or revised since 1998, so the Council approved the formation of a Charter Revision Committee to assist the Mayor and City Council in reviewing and revising the Charter and presenting it to the voters in the next general election.

STREET SAVVY



The City is currently doing preliminary surveying and engineering to see what could be done on some of our streets regarding drainage, potholes, and overall maintenance. We know that there are many streets that exist that are in dire straits of repair.

A few of the streets we are looking into are Hudspeth Ln, Cleveland St, and Train Ln. These are areas where flooding and potholes have been rampant.

On Schoolhouse Ln we applied for and received a grant to make it a newly paved street, as well as curb, gutter and sidewalks from Hwy 62 to the school parking lot. We want the children to be able to be transported safely to school.

Other streets will be assessed as funds allow.
