ODOT: ADOPT-A-HIGHWAY PROGRAM

The Jackson County Fire District #4 Support Group just approved sponsorship of the Highway 62 trash cleanup under the ODOT Adopt-A-Highway Program for mileposts 17–20 (Hammel Road to Bridge at the Rogue River). This was formerly being organized independently by Elizabeth Higgs, along with additional volunteer help. Now the Fire Department support group members will clean this portion of the Highway and in Shady Cove, four times per year, under the ODOT program. FROM MAYOR RICHARDSON'S DESK



The U.S. Constitution mandates that everyone in the country be counted every 10 years and the first U.S. Census was carried out in 1790.

The 2020 Census begins next month and citizens can respond online, by mail, or by phone. The schedule for this year's data gathering is:

| April 20 – 27 | Those not responding will receive a final reminder postcard before census representatives will go door-to-door to gather information. |

An accurate census count is important and beneficial to Oregon.

- For each citizen counted, no matter what age, Oregon receives about \$3,200 in federal tax money to use for schools, health care and transportation.

- Oregon stands to gain another congressional district based on population growth over the last decade. It currently has 5 but after the census is verified, it will probably have 6.
- Business and government leaders use census data to project trends, including eligibility for Medicare and Social Security. Businesses also use this data to decide whether they should move to an area.
- Both the U.S. Census and We Count Oregon will hire temporary, part time workers who will canvas Jackson County. These jobs pay \$17 - \$18 per hour and for more information, applicants can go to 2020census.gov/jobs or wecountoregon.com.

Some people have concerns about privacy but your personal information is protected by law. Under Title 13 of the U.S. Code, the Census Bureau cannot release any identifiable information about individuals, households, or businesses, even to law enforcement agencies. The law states that information can only be used for statistical purposes and all Census Bureau staff must take a lifetime oath to protect personal information; any violation could result in a penalty of up to \$250,000 and/or up to 5 years in prison. To support historical research such as genealogy, Title 44 of the U.S. Code allows the National Archives to release census records after 72 years. However, as writer Max Barry stated, "People resist the census, but give them a profile page and they'll spend all day telling you who they are."

Shady Cove benefits directly from accurate census information through such programs as grants and public fund allocations. Governments and businesses make many decisions about communities based on demographics gleaned from census information. It is to our advantage to provide accurate and timely responses and to encourage our neighbors to do so.
